# Sentence Fun User's Guide

# **About the Program**

An elephant's turban is one piglet long and weighs as much as eight or nine sneakers.

Sentence Fun is designed to help children learn parts of speech by creating comical sentences. Students are asked to identify parts of speech by entering words of their own or by selecting words from a list displayed on the computer screen, choosing from 12 categories of nouns, pronouns, verb tenses, adjectives, adverbs, and conjunctions.

If a student experiences difficulty with identifying a particular part of speech, a help screen is available with a definition and examples of that part of speech. After parts of speech have been identified, a silly story including the selected words appears on the screen.

The often hilarious stories encourage and stimulate students to use the program again and again.

#### Note to teachers and parents

Even though some of the words used in the program represent more than one part of speech, they may be listed as representing only one. For example, the word shampoo in list # 1 is described as a present tense verb, when it can also be used as a noun. This type of listing is only true in cases where the second part of speech represented (but not listed) by the word is not as common as the one which is listed and where

the unlisted part of speech would tend to confuse the student or make the stories awkward to read.

You may wish to discuss the multiple parts of speech which can be shared by various words with your students. For example, *skate* is listed as a present tense verb, a noun, and a word that rhymes with ate. A list of all words used in the program appears at the end of this guide.

# To Begin

Sentence Fun will run on any Apple family computer with at least 48K and a disk drive.

To start, put the program disk into the drive and turn on your computer. If you have Autostart, you will see the title panel displayed.

If your Apple does not have the Autostart ROM, you will see the monitor cursor \*. Type 6, then type P while holding down the key marked Control (6 CTRL P), then press the Return key.

After viewing the title panel, press any key to see the main menu:

Work with word lists Type in your own words Personalize the program

Use the I and M keys or the up and down arrow keys to move the cursor to the activity you want to use and then press the space bar or the Return key to select the activity.

### **Work With Word Lists**

Follow the directions at the top of the screen to select a part of speech. Use the arrow keys or the I and M keys to move the cursor, and press the space bar or the **Return** key to select a word.

If you have problems identifying a word, press the ? key. The program will then show you a definition of the part of speech you are looking for along with some examples. Press any key to continue.

After you have selected all the words that the program needs at this time, it will show you a silly story based on the words you have selected.

As you read the story, press any key to continue onto the next screen. At the end of the story, you have three options: press any arrow key to show the full story again; print the story at this time by pressing the P key as you hold down the key marked Control (CTRL-P); or press any other key to select the words for the next story.

If you choose to print the story, the program will tell you the current slot number of the printer card. If your printer card

is in a different slot, press any key to change the slot number. Pressing the space bar or the **Return** key, however, will print the story using the current slot.

After the story is printed, press any key to continue on to the next story.

Note: You may press the Esc (escape) key at any time to get out of this activity and return to the main menu.

# Type in Your Own Words

Follow the directions at the top of the screen to type in your own words. As you type in each word, it will appear in the center of the screen. Press the **Return** key after you type in each word. If you have a problem understanding the part of speech the program is asking for, press the? key. You will see a definition of the part of speech, along with some examples. Press any key to continue.

After the last entry, the program will display a silly story based on the words you have entered.

As you read the story, press any key to continue onto the next screen. At the end of the story, you have three options: press any arrow key to show the full story again; print the silly story at this time by pressing the P key as you hold

down the key marked Control (CTRL-P); or press any other key to select the words for the next silly paragraph.

If you choose to print the story, the program will tell you the current slot number of the printer card. If your printer card is in a different slot, press any key to change the slot number. Pressing the space bar or the **Return** key, however, will print the story using the current slot.

After the story is printed, press any key to continue onto the next story.

Note: You may press the Esc (escape) key at any time to get out of this activity and return to the main menu.

# **Personalize the Program**

If you select this option, the program will ask you to type in the answers to some questions. It will ask you to enter your first name, last name and where you live. After you have personalized the program, you will return to the main menu. When you work with the program's word lists, or your own words, the stories will contain some of the personalized items. The personalization will not be saved onto the disk. If you want the program to be personalized, you must reenter the data each time you boot the program.

## **Parts of Speech**

The following list defines the parts of speech that the program will ask you to enter.

Noun • A *noun* is a word that names a person, a place, or a thing. (boy, house, apple)

Plural Noun • A plural noun names more than one person, one place, or one thing. (girls, rooms, feet)

Proper Noun • A proper noun names a particular person, place or thing. (Eric, Boston, Mr. Woo)

Subject Pronoun • A subject pronoun is a pronoun used as the subject of a sentence. (I, we, it)

Object Pronoun • An object pronoun is a pronoun used in the predicate of a sentence. (me, him, us)

Possessive Pronoun • A possessive pronoun is a pronoun that shows possession. (my, your, his)

Present Tense Verb • A present tense verb is a word that shows action at the present time. (plays, run, jump)

Past Tense Verb • A past tense verb is a word that shows that an action has already happened. (cleaned, ran, drank)

Future Tense Verb • A future tense verb is a word that shows an action will happen in a future time. (will play, will jump)

Verb Ending In ing •Some verbs used with helping verbs end in ing (jumping, running, sliding)

Adjective • An adjective is a word that describes a noun or pronoun. (big, wise, yellow)

Adverb • An adverb is a word used to modify a verb, an adjective, or another adverb. (carefully, fast)

Conjunction • A conjunction is a word used to connect two other words or groups of words. (and, but, or)

In addition to the above list, Sentence Fun may ask for words that rhyme with: blue, red, cry, ear, dean, bee, air, or ate.
