REPORT OF THE AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS

OF BASUG LIMITED

We have audited the accounts set out on pages 4 to 9 in accordance with approved auditing standards, having regard to the matters referred to in the following paragraphs.

In common with many businesses of similar size and organisation the company's system of control is dependent upon the close involvement of the members of committee responsible for financial and accounting matters. Where independent confirmation of the completion of the accounting records was therefore not available we have accepted assurances from the Committee that all the company's transactions have been reflected in the records.

We have accepted assurances referred to in the preceding paragraph, as to the quantities of disks on hand at 30th June 1984. There were no practical alternative auditing procedures that we could apply to confirm quantities. The value of such stock on hand at 30th June 1984 was £1,911. In our opinion, in the case of the stocks referred to above, proper accounting records have not been kept as required by Section 12 Companies Act 1976.

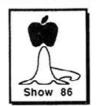

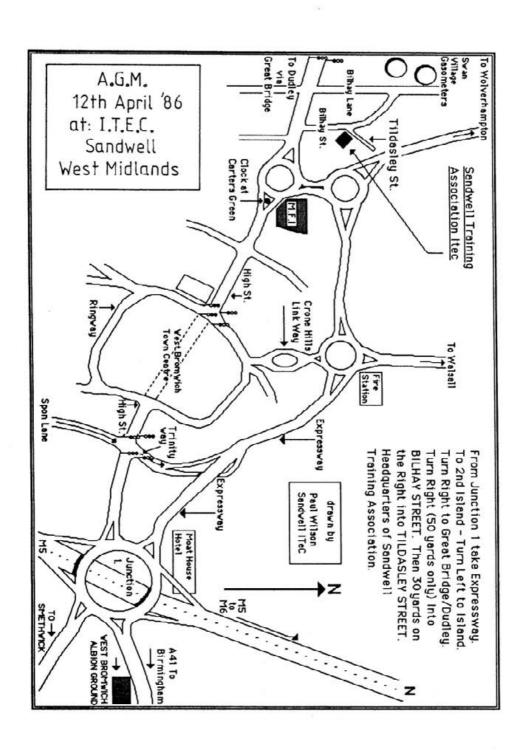

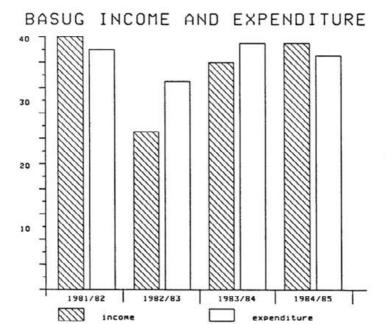
